

Maths Initial Assessment V5.1 Answers



MATHS V5.0

Students should complete Part 1. This can then be marked, using the grid on page 2 of this answer booklet, to determine a student's level and if they need to proceed to Part 2.

All questions are worth one mark each. The level determined is the level the student is *working towards*; therefore, the Diagnostic Assessment should be taken at this level.

Tutors are advised to use their discretion when marking. If students provide answers that are not in the mark scheme but which are themselves appropriate and applicable, marks should still be awarded.

Correct money notation – money should be shown as £ or p, with the decimal point correct and 2 decimal places if appropriate.
